Dear PLJ Beach Club Member:

Thanks to the diligence of Bill Robert, Brent Erickson and others, the road has been re-opened! Working onsite with the maintenance crew who normally works on the road, they were able to get a temporary sand bridge constructed across the flooded area (as shown in the picture below). As of yesterday, they were hauling in caliche to form a harder surface – people have been coming and going from the beach for the past 24 hours. They also expect that service trucks (water, propane, trash) will be able to use this road for the time being.

Note: if you're headed to the beach anytime soon, be sure and bring mosquito repellent. With all the standing water, there are lots of 'em!



Brent is working towards getting a bid to have a more permanent road constructed, complete with culverts to let water pass underneath the road, berms to protect it, and a good solid layer of caliche on top. Obviously, construction of such an improvement will require the participation of each owner's association on the East Beach peninsula.

More information will follow as it is developed. However, for now, if you're so inclined, head for the beach!

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
